



Foreign-trained veterinarians looking for licensure in New Brunswick

To practice as a veterinarian in New Brunswick, you will need a copy of your diploma in addition to a certificate of qualification. The certificate is issued by the National Examination Board (NEB).

If your veterinary diploma was obtained from an accredited university, you simply need to pass your NAVLE (North American Veterinary Licensing Exam) to get your certificate of qualification.
